Pupil Supervisor – St Paul's School

Role

The Pupil Supervisor will be required to supervise pupils during break and lunchtimes, ensuring a calm and positive atmosphere within the school. On occasion they may be required to assist with other areas of activity in the school, for example lesson cover or administrative support to the Attendance team, at the direction of the Deputy Head Pastoral.

Main duties and responsibilities

To undertake supervision of pupils at some or all of the following times and locations throughout the school day.

- Break time (10.15-10.35)
 - Supervision of varied areas of the school, including internal informal assembly areas or areas within the grounds
 - Active patrolling of those areas, ensuring that pupils are behaving sensibly, including challenging problematic behaviour and liaising with senior staff for support as necessary.
- Dining Hall (12:15 -14:20)
 - To support teaching staff in managing pupils through the lunch hall in a timely and orderly manner.
- Lunch time patrols (12:15 14:20)
 - Supervision of varied areas of the school, including internal informal assembly areas or areas within the grounds
 - Active patrolling of those areas, ensuring that pupils are behaving sensibly, including challenging problematic behaviour and liaising with senior staff for support as necessary.
- Lesson Cover (at various times in the day)
 - To ensure quiet and orderly behaviour of pupils in lessons where work has been set by an absent teacher.
- All staff have a responsibility and duty of care to safeguard and promote the welfare of pupils. Staff
 must be aware of the systems within the School which support safeguarding and must act in
 accordance with the School's Safeguarding & Child Protection policy and Code of Conduct. Staff will
 receive appropriate child protection training which is regularly updated.
